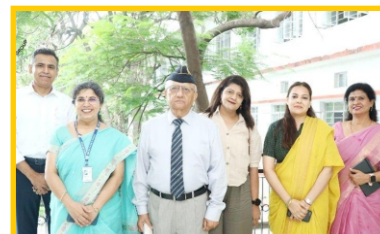


## CBP WORKSHOP AT MPSFG FOR FOUNDATIONAL STAGE TEACHERS

The school had the privilege of hosting an insightful seven-day workshop focused on the foundational stage, aimed at enhancing the assessment methods for our early graders. This comprehensive session was led by esteemed resource persons Ms. Savita Mehta, Ms. Kavita Nag and Ms. Pallavi, renowned for their expertise in early childhood education. The workshop highlighted the crucial aspects of early childhood development. It emphasized the need for creating a nurturing and stimulating environment that supports the cognitive, emotional and social growth of young children. Furthermore, the workshop delved into the National Curriculum Framework for School Education (NCFSE). The session underscored the importance of aligning our curriculum and teaching methods with the NCFSE to promote consistent and equitable educational outcomes. Moving beyond traditional grading, the session introduced the concept of a holistic report card, the creation and use of detailed rubrics and parameters. A significant part of the workshop was dedicated to aligning our assessment methods with the NCERT learning outcomes that provide a standardized framework ensuring that all children meet the essential educational milestones. Teachers participated in role-playing exercises, group discussions and interactive demonstrations, which provided practical insights and fostered a collaborative learning environment.
